Governor to inaugurate Chintan Shivir cum Education Conclave 2024

ITANAGAR, August 07:

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh, Lt. General KT Pamaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.), is going to inaugurate the 3-day 'Chintan Shivir cum Education Conclave 2024' at the DK Convention Center in Itanagar, on 8th August 2024.

Aiming to enhance the education system in Arunachal Pradesh, the conclave, themed 'Shikshit Arunachal - Viksit Arunachal', will see the participation of all stakeholders, including policymakers to provide quality education for every child in the State. It will also highlight the National Initiative for Proficiency in Reading with Understanding and Numeracy (NIPUN Bharat), the Prime Minister Schools for Rising India (PM SHRI Schools), and innovative digital initiatives.

Training programme for government officers on POC SO Act

NAHARLAGUN, August 6:

The Administrative Training Institute (ATI) here organised a two-day workshop on the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012, and the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition & Redressal) Act, 2013.

The workshop, which started on 5 August, was designed for Group A and Group B officers of various government departments, besides police personnel and members of the Internal Complaint Committee on Prevention of Sexual Harassment Act, 2013.

It was aimed at providing comprehensive training on the legal frameworks and mechanisms in place to protect children from sexual offences, and to ensure a safe and respectful workplace environment for women.

"This initiative underscores the commitment of the ATI to enhance the knowledge and skills of government officials in handling sensitive issues related to child protection and workplace harassment," ATI Director Pate Marik informed in a release.

Yupia-based district & ses-

sions court advocate Jennie Kino, and advocate Tapak Uli, who also serves as a prosecuting officer in the home department, led the sessions on the POC SO Act.

Advocates Taba Zim and Taying Nachup delivered lectures on the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace, (Prevention, Prohibition & Redressal) Act, 2013, while the ATI director enlightened the participants about the provisions of the CCS (Conduct) Rules, 1964, with reference to sexual harassment of women at workplace.

"This training programme reflects the ongoing efforts of the state government, the women & child development department, and the ATI to foster a safe, equitable and just environment for all, especially the vulnerable sections of society, including children and women," the release said.

Through interactive sessions, case studies, and practical exercises, the participants gained valuable knowledge and tools to effectively implement and enforce these Acts within their respective departments, the release added.

The workshop was attended by 58 participants.

New District Hospital Building operationalised

NAMSAL, August 7:

The New District Hospital Building which was inaugurated by Chief Minister, Pema Khandu, on 14th February, 2024 has started functioning from August 5 here at Namsai.

In the first phase, the OPDs (Out Patient Departments) were shifted from the old District Hospital Building to the new one. Rest of the sections like In Patient Department (IPD), Casualty, Labour room, Operation theatre, shall be shifted in a phased manner.

The New Hospital Building is equipped with 2(two) Modular Operation theatre and a well-equipped Trauma Centre besides other amenities.

The inauguration and subsequent functioning of the new District Hospital Building mark a significant milestone in the healthcare development of Arunachal Pradesh, reflecting the state government's commitment to improving public health infrastructure. The full transition to the new facility will bring enhanced medical services and improved health outcomes for the local population.

National seminar on rock art ends



RONO HILLS, August 4:

A three-day national seminar on 'Rock art - Archaeology of India: A comparative interpretation with Northeast India', organised by the Adi Drishya Division of the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA), in collaboration with the Indian Council of Historical Research (ICHR) and the anthropological department of Rajiv Gandhi University (RGU), concluded here on Saturday, August 3.

At the inaugural session on 1 August, RGU Vice-Chancellor Prof Saket Kushwaha announced the development of a new rock art museum, to be established by RGU's anthropology department, in collaboration with

the Adi Drishya Division, the university informed in a release.

Prof Ravi Korisetla from the National Institute of Advanced Studies highlighted the importance of rock art in understanding human cognitive development, while RGU Registrar Dr NT Rikam underscored the necessity for further research on Northeast India's rock art sites, and proposed that a memorandum of understanding be signed among RGU's anthropology department, the IGNCA and the ICHR "to foster academic cooperation."

The seminar focused on the historical and cultural significance of rock art and archaeological findings in India, with particular emphasis on

Northeast India.

The discussions covered early archaeological efforts by pioneers such as Alexander Cunningham and Robert Bruce Foote, and examined the cultural connections between Northeast India and Southeast Asia, including the Hoabinhian culture.

The event showcased rock art discoveries across Assam, Mizoram, Nagaland, Arunachal, Tripura, and Manipur, and highlighted the ongoing traditions of rock and wood engraving among indigenous groups. "Comparative studies of rock art in Northeast India and other regions, as well as themes on prehistoric and

Tasing takes stock of aftermath of fire in Pareng

BOLENG, August 2:

Rural Development (RD) Minister Ojing Tasing on Friday took stock of the ground situation following the fire accident that had occurred in Pareng village in Siang district.

Twenty-four houses were destroyed in a devastating fire in the village on Wednesday July 31 evening.

The minister earlier convened a meeting with the administrative officers and HoDs of various departments here on Thursday to work out an immediate plan for helping the victims. He urged the officers of "all essential departments" to visit the village and provide comprehensive aid to the public.

During the meeting, the PHED executive engineer provided an update on the ongoing efforts to restore water supply.

Temporary houses have been constructed, with assistance from the local community and neighbouring villages, near the school ground. The construction of temporary toilets is also underway.

Officials of the urban development department informed the minister of the ongoing cleanup operation in the village, with the UD truck stationed on site.

Additionally, the district disaster management officer informed that, "beyond monetary contributions, essential commodities, including rice bags, blankets, and buckets, have been disbursed to the affected residents."

The DMO informed that an ambulance and a medical team have been stationed at Pareng, with the sub-centre operating round the clock to provide emergency relief.

A pertinent point raised during the meeting was the congested layout of the village, identified as a factor that exacerbated the spread of the fire.

The village authorities have pledged to pursue a resettlement plan characterised by a more organised and spacious layout.

Tasing pledged to provide financial support for the construction of the approach road to the settlement area, underlining the commitment to "not only provide immediate relief but also aid in the long-term rehabilitation and reconstruction efforts."

During his visit to Pareng, the minister distributed relief materials and essential commodities, and joined hands with the villagers to construct temporary houses.

Luminous Lummer Dai Literary Award Ceremony Held



BORDURIA, August 2:

The Luminous Lummer Dai Literary Award-2024 was jointly bestowed upon Thajam Aboh and Wangsam Zongsam, in recognition of their immense contribution to Arunachal literature.

Zongsam is one of the first-generation writers of the Tangsa community, who started writing during his school days. His writings have been published in various prominent Assamese magazines in Assam.

(APLS) president YD Thongchi, Environment & Forest Minister Wangki Lowang, and MLA Wanglin Lowang-dong at the Borduria Towang Lowangdong Auditorium here in Tirap district on Friday, August 2.

DC inspects ongoing developmental projects





DTCC raids shops near education Institutions

All the Shop owners violating COTPA Section 6 (a)&(b) were challaned amounting to Rs 200/- and were warned from further selling . At the end of the surprise checking, all the seized Cigarettes, other tobacco products and alcohol were burnt and disposed near dikrong river Lekhi.

Awareness Campaign on RTI held at Tezu

Whereas, it has been observed that the dwellers of Itanagar especially owner of shops, Resturents, Hotal, Rent House, etc. are dumping household garbage as well as civic waste haphazardly in various locations of Itanagar Capital.

And whereas, due lo haphazard dumping of the garbage, the drains along NH-415 and sector roads are clogged, leading to overflowing of drains and heaps of garbage scattered across NH-415 as well as on sector roads also which is not only posing threat to environmental nuisance & health hazards but also creating a bad looks to the aesthetic beauty of the Itanagar Capital.

And whereas, the Itanagar Municipal Corporation has earmarked garbage pickup vehicles for each sectors of the Itanagar.

And whereas, it is the responsibdy of each dwellers of Itanagar Capital to keep their household garbage, civic waste in dustbin of their home, shops and dump only in the IMC vehicles engaged in collection of dumping waste.

Now. therefore, I, Shri Talo Potom, IAS, District Magistrate, Capital, Itanagar. in exercise of the powers conferred upon me under section 163 (I) of BNSS, 2023, do hereby prohibit all the denizens of Itanagar Capital especially owner of shops, Restaurants, Hotels, Rent House, etc. from haphazard dumping of garbage in the colonies/ sector, RoW of NH-415 other than the garbage pickup vehicles as engaged by the IMC with immediate effect.

The Municipal Commissioner, Itanagar Municipal Corporation alongwith DIPRO, Itanagar are directed to disseminate the same through Public Announcement for strict implementation of this order.

Violators of the above orders will be penalized as per provisions of law.

(ISSUED UNDER SECTION 11(1) OF THE RIGHT TO FAIR COMPENSATION & TRANSPARENCY IN LAND ACQUISITION, REHABILITATION & RESETTLEMENT ACT, 2013)

WHEREAS, the power and function of the appropriate authority under the Right of Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act'2013 vest with the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh which shall be exercise and discharged by him within the state.

WHEREAS, the Requiring Body, 4th BN' ITBP, has sent a requisition vide letter Dated 17/12/2022 for acquisition of land to an extent of 1.619 Hectare for the establishment of BOP by 4th Bn ITBP at T- Sela under Dirang Sub-Division, West Kameng District.

WHEREAS, it appears to the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh that the land is likely to be needed at the locality more fully described in the schedule below for the establishment of BOP by 4th Bn ITBP for an area measuring 1.619 Hectare located at West Kameng District, Arunachal Pradesh.

It is hereby notified that land in the locality/localities in the schedule below is likely to be acquired for the above said purpose at expense of requiring body. **The Commandant 4th BN ITBP vide his letter No.11030/1TBPIEngr14th BN1712023-322 Dated 10th August'2023 has confirmed that there is no human displacement due to this land acquisition and no any Social Impact Assessment (SIA) study is required for the acquisition of land for BOP at T-Sela.**

NOW THEREFORE, this notification is made under the provisions of section 11(1) of the Right to Fair Compensation & Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation & Resettlement Act, 2013 to all whom so ever it may concern.

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh hereby also authorizes the officers and officials for the time being engage for the said purpose with their servant and workman to enter upon and survey any land and to do all other acts in pursuance of the provision of section 12 of the above said Act.

Under Section 11(4) of the Act. no person shall make any transaction or cause any transaction of land i.e., sale/ purchase/ gift, specified in the preliminary notification or create any encumbrances on such land from the date of publication of this notification without prior approval of the collector.

T Taki, and Constables G Komut and O Apum went to Lego’s house, in the presence of the Mebo EAC and independent witnesses, and seized 5.16 gms of suspected hero-

in from the bedroom, along with Rs 63,450 in cash, suspected to be sales proceeds.

Further interrogation revealed the involvement of one Betjom Tayeng (54), of Ayeng village, as Lego’s supplier.

Following this, Tayeng’s house was also searched, with the process videographed, as required by law, and 22.77 grams of suspected heroin, besides sales proceeds of Rs 50,000 in cash, were seized from the house.

A case [u/s 21(b)/20 (a) NDPS Act] has been registered, and the duo has been arrested.

“Further investigation to ascertain more forward-backward linkages is on,” the SP informed.

Meanwhile, the SP informed

that two Assam-based drug peddlers were also arrested and contraband seized from their possession.

“In continuation of the case [u/s 21(b)/20 b (a) NDPS Act], registered at the Mebo police station, a police team lured the peddlers to Arunachal’s jurisdiction, at Bhis-maknagar in Roing (LDV), and, after a short chase, apprehended them with 22.58 gms of suspected heroin.

The arrestees have been identified as Rahim Koch (36) and Ravi Rajkawa alias Roing Dan Mistry (40), both residents of Ambikapur village in Tinsukia (Assam).

The police team that made the arrest comprised Pasighat SDPO Pankaj Lamba, Mebo PS OC K Tangha, and ASI N Perme.
