The Cabinet approved for Amendment of Minimum Qualifying Marks for Recruitment to Group-A, B and C posts and Common Examination Scheme (for Group-C posts) Rules 2023. As per reservation policy, 10 % of Group C posts (Direct Recruitment) are reserved for Ex-Servicemen. Many posts reserved for Ex-Servicemen are vacant, as in many occasions the candidates belonging to Ex-Servicemen category does not qualify the minimum qualifying marks fixed by the Recruiting Agency/ State Government. To resolve the issue, the Cabinet approved the proposal for amendment of minimum qualifying marks for recruitment of ex-servicemen in Group C posts in line of APST candidates and PwBD candidates.

The proposals for amendment of Senior Research Assistant Recruitment Rules and framing of Recruitment Rules to the posts of Deputy Director (Faculty) of Administrative Training Institute got approved by the Cabinet.

The Cabinet approved for amending Public Prosecutor, Additional Public Prosecutor and Assistant Public Prosecutor, Group A, Gazetted (nonministerial) Rules 2023. The New Criminal Laws i.e. Bharatiya Nagrik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023 and the Bharatiya Sakshya Adhiniyam2023 which replace the Cr. PC 1973, the IPC 1860 and the Indian Evidence Act 1872 has come into force with effect from 1st July 2024 has necessitated for changes in the syllabus for direct recruitment to the post of Assistant Public Prosecutor, hence the amendment.

Recruitment rules to the post of Sub Fire Officer in the Department of Fire and Emergency Services, Rules 2024 also got approved by the Cabinet.

- 4. Ensure the inclusion of accurate and comprehensive credits for your film.
- 5. The filmmaker should self-declare the consent & image release signed by the participants in the documentary film.
- 6. Submit the film in 1080.p full HD format and MP4 file type, and ensure it meets the specified quality standards for both audio and video.
- 7. Participation is open to films created in the year 2018 and onwards.
- 8. Documentary should be submitted either on FilmFreeway.com under "Arunachal Film Festival" or physically through a pen drives at the DIPR office, Soochna Bhawan, Papu Nallah.
- 9. The film must be submitted prior to the deadline set by the organizers, which is December 31st, 2024.
- 10. Filmmakers to bear the cost of transportation for carrying the film materials by themselves.
- 11. Films that were submitted in the previous Arunachal Film Festival will not be allowed to participate again.
- 12. The film should not be uploaded or made available on any social media platform.
- 13. The films, trailers, clippings and posters of the selected films will be put in the official social media pages as well as in the archive of the Arunachal Film Festival, and will be used for further promotional and publicity purposes of the AFF. Ownership right of the film to remain with the filmmaker.
- 14. All disputes in respect of any matter relating to the AFF shall be subjected to the exclusive jurisdiction of the competent courts and forums in Itanagar capital region.

GUIDELINES FOR SHORT FILM ENTRIES:

- 1. The Short Film Festival category is exclusively open to residents of Arunachal Pradesh.
- 2. The film's duration should not surpass the 15 minute time limit including the credits.
- 3. Films can be in any language or dialect, but it is mandatory to provide English subtitles.
- 4. Filmmakers must provide proof of ownership or clearance for all music, graphics, and visual assets used in the film.
- 5. Ensure the inclusion of accurate and comprehensive credits for your film.
- 6. The film should be submitted in H.264 codec format, meeting the specified quality standards for both audio and video. The resolution must be at least 1080p.
- 7. The link to the short film should be submitted via email to diprarunx@gmail.com and affdipr2013@gmail.com, or physically through a pen drive at the DIPR office, Soochna Bhawan, Papu Nallah.
- 8. The film must be submitted prior to the deadline set by the organizers, which is December 31st, 2024.
- 9. The organizers won't bear the Cost of transportation for carrying film materials.
- 10. By submitting, filmmakers agree that their films, trailers, clips, and posters may be featured on official social media pages and archived for future promotional and publicity purposes related to the Arunachal Film Festival.
