## Governor addresses Ex-Servicemen

ITANAGAR, October 14:

The Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.) called upon the Ex-Servicemen (ESM) to commit themselves in the service of the society and contribute towards the progress of the Nation.

Addressing the 10th Veteran Sainik Sammelan of the 2nd Battalion The Rajputana Rifles at Bhiwani, Haryana on Sunday, October 13, the Governor said that the Ex-Servicemen have defended the border and secured the territorial integrity of the nation, now as they have transitioned into civilian life, their mission is far from over. He said that with their exclusive skill, vigilance, strength and an unwavering sense of duty, they can contribute toward justice, equity and transparent governance.

The Governor exhorted the Ex-Servicemen to utilize their expertise in different fields in providing leadership, creating awareness and mentorship to the youth. He advised them to motivate the youth of the day to join the Indian Armed Forces, which, he said, is one of the most respectable professions in the country.

Highlighting the welfare programme for the Ex-Servicemen, the

Governor underscored the Self-Employment Schemes for them. A director level officer from the Directorate General Resettlement in Army Headquarters was also present to apprise ESM of various opportunities.

Later the Governor along with a number of serving and retired officers and Junior Commission Officers (JCO) of 2 Raj Rif, met the old veterans who served together and joined the Ex-Servicemen in a 'Bara Khana'.

It may be mentioned here that the Governor was commissioned in 2 Rajputana Rifles of TOLOLING fame, on 31st March 1972, which he later commanded in Rajasthan Sector and Jammu & Kashmir. The 2nd Battalion of the Rajputana Rifles (2 RAJ RIF) of the Indian Army fought in the 1999 Kargil War and captured Tololing Top and the area around Point 4590, which was a turning point in the war. The 2 RAJ RIF's capture of the peak was the Indian Army's first victory. The Unit was awarded four Maha Vir Chakras, seven Vir Chakras, nine Sena Medals, and two Mention-in-Despatches.

The 2 RAJ RIF was formerly known as the 120th Rajputana Infantry and is India's oldest rifle regiment.

## Governor adopts TB patients of Kamle and Daporijo Districts

ITANAGAR, October 13:

In line with India's commitment to eradicate Tuberculosis (TB) by 2025, and inspiring the people of the State, the Governor of Arunachal Pradesh Lt. General KT Parnaik, PVSM, UYSM, YSM (Retd.), has adopted two TB patients each from Kamle and Upper Subansiri districts as part of the Ni-Kshay Mitra initiative under the Pradhan Mantri TB Mukh Bharat Abhiyaan (PMT-BMBA). He has already adopted two each from other districts also.

The Governor appealed to the people, especially elected representatives, community leaders, NGOs, Self-Help Groups, business houses, and generous individuals, to step forward and become Ni-Kshay Mitras. He said that while TB treatment in India is largely provided free of cost through government health services, Ni-Kshay Mitras play a crucial role in filling gaps related to nutrition and patient support, ensuring comprehensive care for those affected.

The Governor explained that the Ni-Kshay Mitra program allows individuals, organizations, institutions, and even corporate entities to adopt TB patients, offering them supplementary nutritional support during treatment. He highlighted that many TB patients discontinue their treatment due to its long duration, but with the support of a Ni-Kshay Mitra, they receive not only nutritional aid but also moral and emotional encouragement to complete their treatment. This is crucial to prevent the development of drug-resistant TB.

The Governor stressed the importance of a community-based approach to raise awareness and reduce the stigma surrounding the disease. He said that the Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's initiative is helping TB patients recover more quickly and also contributing to public health by preventing the spread of the disease through community involvement and support.

## Wangsu attends 37th Foundation Day of ICAR-National research Centre-Medziphema

"Mithun a gentle giant is the thermometer to understand the quality of environment; where Mithun thrives, it may be taken for granted that the natural environment is at its best", said Gabriel D. Wangsu, Minister for AHV, Agri, Food and Civil Supply, etc Govt of Arunachal Pradesh while releasing the road map for Revitalizing Mithun Sector in Arunachal Pradesh on the occasion of 37th Foundation Day of ICAR-

National research Centre- Medziphema, Nagaland on Monday, October 15.

The minister, who was the Chief Guest of the day-long function, vehemently advocated protecting and propagating Mithun rearing since it is the most prized possession of the tribal communities since it is intricately linked to tribal culture and traditions. Calling upon the need of all the Mithun rearing states to share common platform to address the concerns the Min-

ister insisted on declaring Mithun as domestic animal in a cohesive manner.

"Even there is need to seek international collaboration of all the Mithun rearing nations especially Bhutan, Myanmar and Bangladesh so that the Mithun farmers get the best since the gentle giant has been recognized as a food animal", Wangsu observed in presence of large gathering of scientists and farmers.

## Yupia DC office premises to be tobacco free zone

YUPIA, October 16:

The District Level Coordination Committee on National Tobacco Control Programme has decided to declare the Yupia DC Office premises as a tobacco free zone during the District level Coordination meeting held at the DC Conference Hall, Yupia on Wednesday, October 16.

The committee chaired by DC Jiken Bomjen also discussed modalities to effectively implement the Tobacco Free Youth Campaign 2.0 across the district.

Papum Pare will be targeting to declare 20 villages and 160 schools as tobacco free zones by the end of the 60 days Tobacco Free Youth Campaign 2.0 on 24th November, 2024.

Chairing the meeting DC Jiken Bomjen announced stricter enforcement of anti-tobacco laws including strict adherence to shop opening/closure timings, unannounced checkings, and constitution of strong enforcement teams at block level.

"The health and future of our young people are at stake. We cannot afford to ignore the growing number of youth who are falling into the trap of tobacco addiction. This campaign is a collective effort to educate, prevent,

and protect our youth from the harmful effects of tobacco and nicotine." He stated.

DMO Dr. R. Reena Rony spoke on the severe consequences of tobacco consumption, such as respiratory diseases, cancer, and addiction.

She also focused on debunking myths surrounding vaping and e-cigarettes, which are often mistakenly seen as safer alternatives to smoking.

Dr. L. Chuki, District Program Officer, NTCP highlighted the features of the campaign which included series of workshops, awareness programs and interactive sessions in schools and colleges across the district.

"Youth ambassadors in schools and colleges will be selected to lead peer-to-peer initiatives, and informative material will be distributed through various media channels, including social media platforms" Dr. Chuki further informed.

Dr. Chuki also informed that CHC Doimukh has been selected as the Tobacco cessation centre for Papum Pare; where nicotine patches and chewing gums will be made available for those people desiring to quit smoking.

## Multispecialty Mega Health Camp held

Ministers attends inaugural ceremony at PHC Tirbin



TIRBIN, October 11:

As many as 3,150 patients from Tirbin and nearby areas benefitted from a multispecialty health camp organised here in Leparada district from 10 to 12 of this month.

The camp was an initiative of Basar MLA Nyabi Dirchi, in collaboration with the TRIHMS, the District Health Society, the State Cancer Society, the Siang Health Mission, and the GRK Society. It was inaugurated by Health Minister Biyuram Wahge along with SJETA Minister Kento Jini.

A laparoscopic tubal ligation

camp was held on 10 October, where in 29 tubectomies were done.

Doctors from the TRIHMS, BPGH Pasighat, and the Leparada district hospital, specialising in the fields of cardiology, orthopaedics, surgery, medicine, paediatrics, gynaecology, dermatology, ENT, ophthalmology, oncology, etc, conducted the camp.

The doctors provided 94 echocardiography, 459 ultrasonography, 385 endoscopy, 107 ECG, 172 laboratory investigations, 206 tooth extractions, 14 tooth fillings, 10 minor

orthopaedic and surgical procedures, and 300 free spectacles, besides free medicines to the needy patients.

First aid training during various emergency situations was imparted to 21 volunteers of the area by doctors of the TRIHMS' emergency medicine & trauma department. Wheelchairs, crutches and walking sticks were also provided to amputees and patients with musculoskeletal defects.

TRIHMS Director Dr Moji Jini and New Delhi-based RML Hospital's organ transplant surgeon Dr Arun Kapur also attended the camp.

## World Statistics Day

Every five years, World Statistics Day is marked on 20 October. The day is celebrated to mark the importance of statistics in human lives. The day aims to create awareness about the achievements of official statistics that were based on the values of service, professionalism, and integrity.

World Statistics Day is organised under the United Nations Statistical Commission every five years. The global campaign is coordinated by the Statistics Division of the UN's Department of Economic Affairs (UNSD). The UN will observe the next World Statistics Day on 20 October 2025, in accordance with its tradition of marking the day every five years.

**History:**

The UN's Statistical Commission was formed in the year 1947. But the Commission adopted the Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics in 1994 only.

The decision to observe World Statistics Day was taken at the 41st session of the UN Statistical Commission in February 2010. The first World Statistics Day was celebrated on 20 October 2010, with the theme “Celebrating the many achievements of official statistics”. The day was celebrated in honour of the continuous stream of information that the UNSD gives to people globally to ensure good governance, transparency and accountability.

In 2015, the day was marked once again, with the theme of “Better data, better lives.” In 2015, it was also decided to mark the occasion every five years.

In 2020, the theme for the third World Statistics Day was “Connecting the world with data we can trust”. The theme aimed at reflecting the importance of authoritative data, trust, innovation, and the public good in the statistical systems of nations.

**Significance:**

Statistics are immensely important to academic research as well as the development of civil society and businesses. Statistics are indispensable to the social and economic development of any country. World Statistics Day celebrates the process of collecting, analysing, and interpreting huge amounts of massive data to contribute to the betterment of society. Countries come together on this day to collaborate on statistical management and dedicate more effort to the process of gathering statistics.

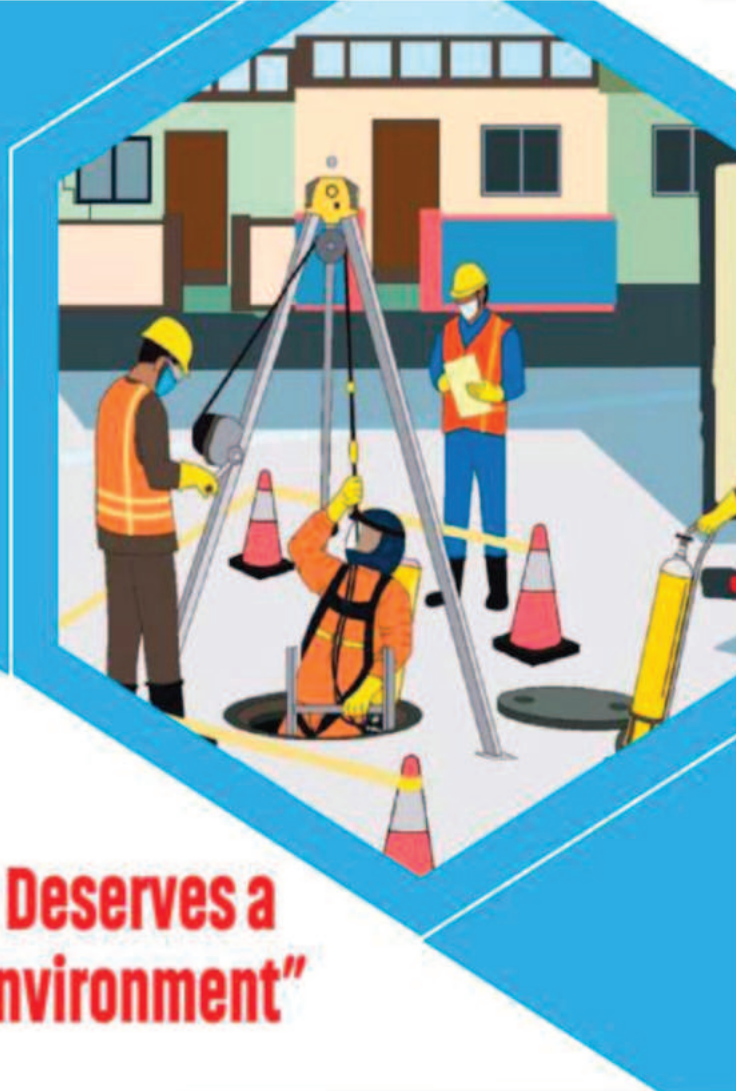
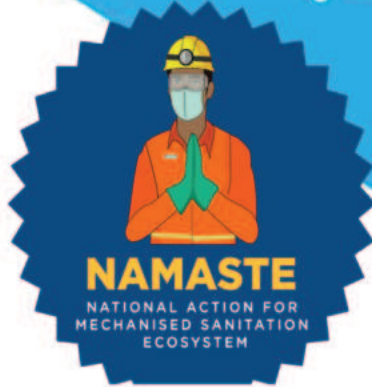

6. Submit the film in 1080.p full HD format and MP4 file type, and ensure it meets the specified quality standards for both audio and video.
7. Participation is open to films created in the year 2018 and onwards.
8. Documentary should be submitted either on FilmFreeway.com under "Arunachal Film Festival" or physically through a pen drives at the DIPR office, Soochna Bhawan, Papu Nallah.
9. The film must be submitted prior to the deadline set by the organizers, which is December 31st, 2024.
10. Filmmakers to bear the cost of transportation for carrying the film materials by themselves.
11. Films that were submitted in the previous Arunachal Film Festival will not be allowed to participate again.
