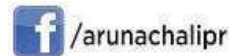

### DCM launches 'Jal Utsav'

Encourages Collective Responsibility for Water Conservation

NAMSAL, November 7:

## State govt has fulfilled promise by increasing capacity of TRIHMS medical college - CM

### Induction ceremony of 100 MBBS students in TRIHMS held



NAHARLAGUN, November 7:

Chief Minister Pema Khandu hailed the induction of 100 MBBS students in TomoRiba Institute of Health and Medical Science (TRIHMS) as a

'historic day' not only for the state's lone medical college but for the state too.

"A new chapter in the history of TRIHMS has been uncovered to-

day," he said, while congratulating and welcoming the newly inducted students in a simple but impressive ceremony here at TRIHMS on Wednesday.

From this academic year the number of seats for the MBBS course in TRIHMS has been increased to 100 from the existing 50, an objective Khandu has been striving for since the college's inception.

Khandu expressed happiness that the increase in number of seats from this year meant that more numbers of local youths will get the opportunity to pursue medicine.

"What is more substantial is the fact that 85 of the 100 seats are reserved for APST students which is a huge jump from about 30 MBBS seats before the start of the medical college," he said.

Khandu noted that the state government has fulfilled its promise to the people of Arunachal Pradesh to increase the capacity of TRIHMS medical college along with an increase in seats reserved for APST aspirants.

He recalled the historic day in 2018, when as the Chief minister, he had attended the induction ceremony of the first ever MBBS batch of the institute, who have since completed their internships and passed from the college in May this year.

## 285<sup>th</sup> Death anniversary of HH Shri Ram Aata and Nocte Saint Narottam observed

- Denhang Bosai, Rtd DD(IPR)



In his quest for spiritual fulfilment, Aang Lotha Khunbao renounced worldly and material pursuits, leaving Namsang village to become a devoted disciple of Shri Ram Aata after abdicating his throne and handing over responsibilities to his son.

This exemplifies the fact that the Noctes possessed spiritual richness even centuries ago, being the first tribe from what is now Arunachal Pradesh (formerly NEFA) to embrace Hinduism, specifically Vaisnavism. Even today, the Assam Buranji and some Sattras in Assam recognize the Noctes as Vaisnavites.

According to legend, Lotha Khunbao, the Aang of undivided Namsang-Borduria, first saw his guru Shri Ram Aata in a dream and later travelled to the Merbil Chaliha Bareghar Sattras in Sasoni to meet him. Through his knowledge, discipline, and spiritual devotion, Khunbao became Shri Ram Aata's most favoured and trusted disciple. Impressed by Khunbao's spiritual conduct, Shri Ram Aata gave him the name Narottam, meaning "man of the highest virtue."

Narottam contributed significantly not only to the growth of the Sattras at Sasoni but also to spreading the teachings of Vaisnavism in the Nocte villages of undivided Tirap district. Namghars were established in these villages, especially in the lower belt, where Satradhikars regularly visited to conduct spiritual activities, including Bhavnas.

The Aangs of Borduria and Namsang adopted Vaisnavism as their faith and generously supported the Satradhikars in maintaining the Namghars. Interestingly, both Shri Ram Aata and Narottam passed away on the same day, with legends claiming that their funeral pyres met in the skies. It is therefore fitting to say that Narottam was the first Nocte saint who preached Vaisnavism and planted the seeds of the faith in the Nocte regions.

The two-day event was also attended by the Chiefs/Aangs of Borduria and Namsang from Tirap District, Arunachal Pradesh.

The program highlighted the enduring cordial relationship between Assam and the Nocte tribe of Arunachal Pradesh, and is expected to further strengthen this age-old cultural bond.

and MLAs from both Assam and Tirap district. Satradhikars and their disciples from various Sattras, along with chiefs and devotees from the Nocte community, also attended the significant event.

It is worth noting that the young Aang (Raja) of the undivided Borduria and Namsang villages, Lotha Khunbao, later became widely known as Narottam, meaning "supreme among men" or "a man of the highest virtue."

Later, all the seized items were disposed of at the premises of Doimukh SDO Office in the presence of Kipa Raja, SDO Doimukh and inspection team members which also included officials of Department of Trade & Commerce, Yupia and Police Personnel from Doimukh PS.

These ongoing developments are part of a broader goal of transforming the destination into one of the biggest pilgrimage centers of Northeast India.

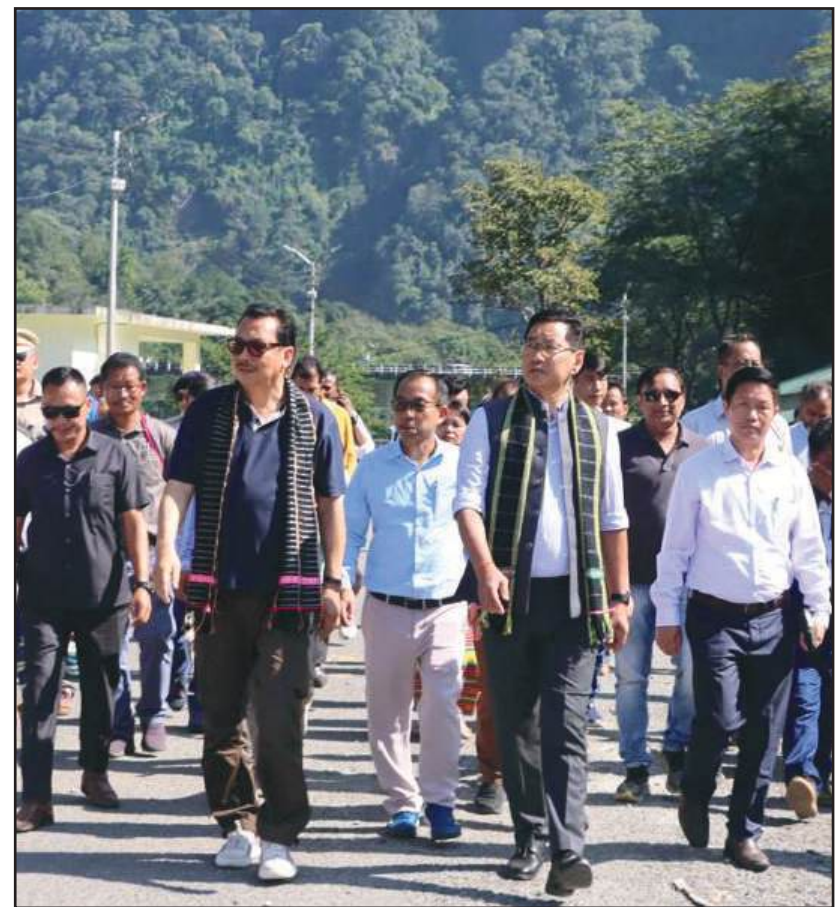
